



FINANCE & REVENUE

Councilman Patrick Gilligan read his report as follows:

As of December 1st, 2017, the Borough had a starting balance of **\$2,530,103.35**

During the month of December, 2017, the borough received revenue in the amount of **\$662,796.75**

The borough paid out in disbursements a total of **\$1,325,014.92**, the biggest total amount paid to local and regional school tax.

The remaining balance as of December 31st, 2018 is **\$1,867,885.18**

And finally, in our various bond accounts, we have a balance of **\$2,800,103.06**

WHEREAS, the regulations provide for the deferral of not more than 50% of the annual levy when school taxes are raised for a school year and have not been requisitioned by the school district; and



WHEREAS, the Borough is in 2017 rented a bucket truck with much success for Public Works employees to trim trees located on Borough property or in the Borough right-of-way; and




WHEREAS, educational variety not only helps to diversify our economy, but also enhances the vibrancy of our community; and,
