SHARED SERVICE AGREEMENT BY AND BETWEEN THE BOROUGH OF STRATFORD AND THE STRATFORD FREE LIBRARY

THIS AGREEMENT made this	day of February, 2020 by and between
the Borough of Stratford ("Stratford"), a M	Junicipal Corporation of the State of New
Jersey, having its principal place of busines	ss located at 307 Union Avenue, Stratford,
New Jersey 08084, and the Stratford Free Li	brary ("the Library"), a public library in the
State of New Jersey, having its principal place	ce of business located at 303 Union Avenue,
Stratford, New Jersey 08084;	
TENTATION OF THE 1 THE	to the control of the

WHEREAS, Stratford and Library are desirous of entering into a Shared Service Agreement pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A:65-1 et seq., whereby Stratford would maintain the Library's grounds, including cutting and edging the lawn, trimming shrubs, mulching the gardens and planting annuals, and clearing and salting the sidewalks and parking lot, as well as providing minor building maintenance services; and

WHEREAS, by Resolution adopted, 2020, Stratford	aumonzeu
the execution of a Shared Service Agreement with the Library for the mainten	ance of the
Library property; and	

WHEREAS, by Resolution adopted _______, 2020, the Library authorized the execution of a Shared Service Agreement with Stratford for the maintenance of the Library property; and

WHEREAS, Stratford is agreeable to providing said services;

NOW, THEREFORE, for and in consideration of the mutual covenants and agreements between the parties and for the consideration set forth below, the parties hereto agree as follows:

- 1. <u>Term.</u> The term of this agreement shall be from January 01, 2020 through and including December 31, 2020.
- 2. <u>Services</u>. Stratford shall provide the labor, equipment and fuel to complete the following services for the Library:
 - a. cutting all lawn areas owned by the Library which includes edging all sidewalk and curbed area and blowing off leaves on the same schedule and at the same time when the same landscape maintenance is being performed in the adjacent Borough buildings complex;
 - b. weeding and mulching of garden areas and planting of spring annuals and autumn mums on the same schedule and at the same time when the same task is being performed in the adjacent Borough buildings complex; mulch, spring annuals, and mums provided by Stratford;

- c. trimming of shrubs twice per year on the same schedule and at the same time when the same task is being performed in the adjacent Borough buildings complex;
- d. clearing of snow from the Library parking lot and sidewalks and salting as necessary on the same schedule and at the same time when the same task is being performed in the adjacent Borough buildings complex; salt provided by Stratford;
- e. minor building maintenance of the Library building including and limited to minor repairs, clearing of debris from the roof, and minor maintenance required for compliance with fire safety regulations, performed on request between the hours of 9 a.m. and 3 p.m.; extreme emergency assistance only is available outside of these hours; required materials paid for by the Library.
- 3. <u>Fees to Stratford.</u> The Library shall pay Stratford for the lawn maintenance, mulching, annuals and mums, shrub trimming, and plowing and sidewalk clearing services provided the sum of \$5,500.00 for the term. Payments of \$1,375.00 are to be made quarterly, due March 15, June 15, September 15, and December 15.

The Library shall pay Stratford for building maintenance services at the rate of \$100.00 per hour, minimum \$100.00, additional time billed by the half hour, and including travel time to obtain supplies; supplies to be paid for by the Library; service fee to be billed and paid when service provided.

- 4. <u>Property</u>. The Library property is the location and area known as 303 Union Ave., Stratford, Block 49, Lot 11.
- 5. <u>Insurance</u>. The Parties will keep in force, at their respective sole expense, comprehensive general liability insurance with insurance companies licensed in the State of New Jersey or with Camden County or the Joint Insurance Fund
- 6. <u>Indemnification</u>. To the fullest extent permitted by law, the Library shall indemnify, defend, and hold harmless Stratford, its agents and employees, from and against all claims, damages, losses, liabilities and expenses, including, but not limited to, attorney's fees and court costs, arising out of, resulting from or in any way relating to, either directly or indirectly:
 - a. the neglect or intentional acts or omissions of the Library, its employees, agents and/or subcontractors;
 - b. bodily injury, sickness and/or disease, including death, at any time resulting from such bodily injury, sickness or disease, sustained by any person while in, on or about the site and surrounding areas where such injury, sickness, disease and/or death arose out of or was in any way connected with negligence or carelessness, or failure of Stratford to properly perform the work;

- c. any liability based upon Stratford's negligence imputed to the Library;
- d. damage to property of Stratford, the Library or any other person or entity arising out of, incident to, or in connection with Stratford's carelessness or negligence in performance of the work;
- e. laborers, mechanics and materialmen's liens, and all other liens and charges of every character whatsoever, arising out of work to be performed by this agreement; and/or
- f. any other cause of action which may be brought against the Library arising out of or in any way relating to Stratford's obligations hereunder.
- 7. Subcontractors. Stratford shall employ or subcontract only with persons and entities that are fit and skilled in the tasks assigned, and shall at all times enforce the strict discipline and good order among the employees and subcontractors engaged to perform the work. Stratford shall maintain a sufficient number of skilled laborers on the job at all times to properly and diligently perform the work in accordance with this agreement.
- 8. <u>Assignment, delegation or transfer</u>. Stratford acknowledges and agrees that the services and duties required of Stratford hereunder are personal, as a result of which Stratford shall not assign, delegate or otherwise transfer any of its rights or duties hereunder without prior written consent of the Library, such consent to be given or withheld by the Library at the Library's sole discretion, but such consent shall not be unreasonably withheld. Any attempted assignment, delegation or transfer by Stratford without such consent of the Library shall be of no force or effect whatsoever and shall be null and void.
- 9. <u>Action or failure to act</u>. It is understood and agreed by the parties that a failure or delay in the enforcement of any of the provision of this Agreement by either of the parties shall not be construed as a waiver of those provisions.
- 10. <u>Affirmative Action</u>. The parties hereto agree to incorporate herein the requirements of P.L. 1975, c. 127, as amended, and Stratford further agrees to comply with the regulations promulgated thereto by the Treasurer, as set forth at N.J.C.A. 17:27-5.2, et seq. Specifically, during the performance of this contract, Stratford agrees as follows:
 - a. Stratford or subcontractor, where applicable, will not discriminate against any employee or applicant for employment because of age, race, creed, color, national origin, ancestry, marital status or sex, affectional or sexual orientation. Stratford will take affirmative action to ensure that such applicants are recruited and employed, and that employees are treated during employment, without regard

to their age, race, creed, color, national origin, ancestry, marital status or sex, affectional or sexual orientation. Such action shall include, but not be limited to the following: employment, upgrading, demotion, or transfer; recruitment or recruitment advertising; layoff or termination; rates of pay or other forms of compensation; and selection for training, including apprenticeship. Stratford agrees to post in conspicuous places, available to employees and applicants for employment, notices to be provided by the Public Agency Compliance Officer setting forth provision of this nondiscrimination clause;

- b. Stratford or subcontractor, where applicable, will in all solicitations or advertisements for employees placed by or on behalf of Stratford, state that all qualified applicants will receive consideration for employment without regard to age, race, creed, color, national origin, ancestry, marital status or sex, affectional or sexual orientation;
- c. Stratford or subcontractor, where applicable, will send to each labor union or representative of workers with which it has a collective bargaining agreement or other contract or understanding, a notice, to be provided by the Agency Contracting Officer advising the labor union or workers' representative of Stratford's commitments under this act and shall post copies of the notice in conspicuous places available to employees and applicants for employment.
- d. Stratford or subcontractor, where applicable, agrees to comply with any regulations promulgated by the Treasurer pursuant to P.L. 1975, c. 127, as amended and supplemented from time to time and the Americans with Disabilities Act.
- e. Stratford or subcontractor agrees to attempt in good faith to employ minority and female workers consistent with the applicable county employment goals prescribed by N.J.A.C. 17:27-5.2 promulgated by the Treasurer pursuant to P.L. 1975, c.127, as amended and supplemented from time to time or in accordance with a binding determination of the applicable county employment goals determined by the Affirmative Action Office pursuant to N.J.A.C. 17:27-5.2 promulgated by the Treasurer pursuant to P.L. 1975, c.127, as amended and supplemented from time to time.
- f. Stratford or subcontractor agrees to inform in writing appropriate recruitment agencies in the area, including employment agencies, placement bureaus, colleges, universities, labor unions, that it does not discriminate on the basis of age, creed, color, national origin, ancestry, marital status or sex, affectional or sexual orientation, and that is will discontinue the uses of any recruitment agency which engages in direct or indirect discriminatory practices.

- g. Stratford or subcontractor agrees to revise any of its testing procedures, if necessary, to assure that all personnel testing conforms with the principles of job-related testing, as established by the statutes and court decisions of the State of New Jersey and as established by applicable federal law and applicable federal court decisions.
- h. Stratford or subcontractor agrees to review all procedures relating to transfer, upgrading, downgrading and layoff to ensure that all such actions are taken without regard to age, creed, color, national origin, ancestry, marital status or sex, affectional or sexual orientation, and conform with the applicable employment goals, consistent with the statutes and court decisions of the State of New Jersey, and applicable federal law and applicable federal court decisions.

Stratford and its subcontractors shall furnish such reports or other documents to the Affirmative Action Office as may be requested by the office from time to time in order to carry out the purposes of these regulations, and public agencies shall furnish such information as may be requested by the Affirmative Action Office for conducting a compliance investigation pursuant to Subchapter 10 of the Administrative Code (N.J.A.C. 17:27).

- 11. Entire understanding. This agreement sets forth the entire understanding between the Library and Stratford with respect to the subject matter hereof. No change in, addition to, or waiver of any provisions of this agreement shall be binding upon either party unless in writing, signed by all parties.
- 12. <u>Amendments</u>. This agreement may be amended or modified only in writing signed by both parties.
- 13. Severability. In the event that any provision or portion of this agreement shall be determined to be invalid and/or unenforceable for any reason, the remaining provisions of this agreement shall remain in full force and effect to the fullest extent permitted by law, unless the agreement, as so construed, would substantially frustrate the purpose of the parties in entering into this agreement.
- 14. <u>Notices</u>. All notices given pursuant to the terms of this agreement shall be sent by certified mail or hand delivered to the Borough Administrator or to the Librarian, respectively, to the addresses listed below:

RESOLUTION PROVIDING FOR A MEETING NOT OPEN TO THE PUBLIC IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE PROVISIONS OF THE NEW JERSEY OPEN PUBLIC MEETINGS ACT, NJSA 10:4-12

WHEREAS, the Governing Body of the Borough of Stratford is subject to certain requirements of the Open Public Meetings Act, NJSA 10:4-6 et seq., and

WHEREAS, the Open Public Meetings Act, NJSA 10:4-12, provides that an Executive Session, not open to the public, may be held for certain specified purposes when authorized by Resolution, and

WHEREAS, it is necessary for the Governing Body of the Borough of Stratford to discuss in a session

not open to the public certain matters relating to the item or items authorized by NJSA 10:4-12b and designated below:
(1) <i>Matters required by Law to be Confidential</i> : Any matter which, by express provision of Federal law or State statute or rule of court shall be rendered confidential or excluded from the provisions of the Open Public Meetings Act.
(2) Matters Where the Release of Information Would Impair the Right to Receive Funds: Any matter in which the release of information would impair a right to receive funds from the Government of the United States.
(3) <i>Matters Involving Individual Privacy</i> : Any material the disclosure of which constitutes an unwarranted invasion of individual privacy such as any records, data, reports, recommendations, or other personal material of any educational, training, social service, medical, health, custodial, child protection, rehabilitation, legal defense, welfare, housing, relocation, insurance and similar program or institution operated by a public body pertaining to any specific individual admitted to or served by such institution or program, including, but not limited to information relative to the individual's personal and family circumstances, and any material pertaining to admission, discharge, treatment, progress or condition of any individual, unless the individual concerned (or, in the case of a minor or incompetent, his guardian) shall request in writing that the same be disclosed publicly.
(4) <i>Matters Relating to Collective Bargaining Agreements</i> : Any collective bargaining agreement, or the terms and conditions which are proposed for inclusion in any collective bargaining agreement, including the negotiation of the terms and conditions thereof with employees or representatives of employees of the public body.
(5) Matters Relating to the Purchase, Lease or Acquisition of Real Property or the Investment of Public Funds: Any matter involving the purchase, lease, or acquisition of real property with public funds, the setting of banking rates or investment of public funds, where it could adversely affect the public interest if discussion of such matters were disclosed.
(6) <i>Matters Relating to Public Safety and Property</i> : Any tactics and techniques utilized in protecting the safety and property of the public, provided that their disclosure could impair such protection. Any investigations of violations of possible violations of the law.

(7) Matters Relating to Litigation, Negotiations and the Attorney-Client Privilege:
The topic of discussion is related to Attorney/Client Privilege. These items are for #7 of the Executive
Session Resolution for matter relating to litigation, contract negotiations, or the Attorney-Client
Privilege. re: Stratford Square
X (8) Matters Relating to the Employment Relationship: Any matter involving the employment, appointment, termination of employment, terms and conditions of employment, evaluation of the performance of promotion or disciplining of any specific prospective public officer or employee or current public officer or employee employed or appointed by the public body, unless all the individual employees or appointees whose rights could be adversely affected request in writing that such matter or matters be discussed at a public meeting.
(9) Matters Relating to the Potential Imposition of a Penalty: Any deliberations of a
public body occurring after a public hearing that may result in the imposition of a specific civil penalty upon the responding party or the suspension or loss of a license or permit belonging to the responding party bears responsibility.

AGREEMENT FOR PROFESSIONAL PLANNING SERVICES

WHEREAS, the BOROUGH desires to engage the CONSULTANT to render certain technical and/or professional services herein described as Redevelopment Planner.


VII. TIME OF PERFORMANCE
