WHEREAS, mutual aid and assistance agreements between municipalities, counties, law enforcement agencies police, Emergency Medical Service, fire departments, fire companies, or EMS organizations and fire departments situated in fire districts operated by a Board of Fire Commissioners, are permitted pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A:14-26 and 40A:14-156.1; and

WHEREAS, the President in Homeland Security Directive (HSPD) – 5, directed the Secretary of the Department of Homeland Security to develop and administer a National Incident Management System (NIMS), which would provide a consistent nationwide approach to Federal, State, local and tribal governments to work together more effectively and efficiently to prevent, prepare for, respond to and recover from domestic incidents, regardless of cause, size or complexity; and

WHEREAS, "The New Jersey Civilian Defense and Disaster Control Act" App.A9 -33 et. seq., provides for the health, safety and welfare of the people of the State of New Jersey during any emergency by centralizing control of all civilian activities having to do with such emergency giving the Governor control over the resources of each and every political subdivision to cope with any condition that shall arise out of such emergency; and

SHARED SERVICES AGREEMENT BY AND BETWEEN THE BOROUGH OF STRATFORD AND THE BOROUGH OF MOUNT EPHRAIM FOR THE ELECTRICAL SUB-COD OFFICIAL/INSPECTOR PURSUANT TO N.J.S.A. 40A:65-1 ET SEQ.

THIS AGREEMENT made this day of, 2020, by and between the
Borough of Stratford ("Stratford"), a Municipal Corporation of the State of New Jersey, having its principal
place of business located at 307 Union Avenue, Stratford, New Jersey 08084, and the Borough of Mt.
Ephraim ("Mt. Ephraim"), a Municipal Corporation of the State of New Jersey, having its principal place
of business located at 121 South Black Horse Pike, Mt. Ephraim, New Jersey, 08059-1796;
WHEREAS, Stratford and Mt. Ephraim are desirous of entering into a Shared Services
Agreement("Agreement") pursuant to the Uniform Shared Services and Consolidation Act (N.J.S.A.
40A:65-1 et seq.) ("Shared Services Act"), whereby Stratford would provide the services of its Electrical
Sub-code Official/Inspector to Mt. Ephraim; and
WHEREAS, by Resolution adopted, 2020, Mt. Ephraim authorized the
execution of a Shared Services Agreement ("Agreement") with Stratford for the services of Stratford's
Electrical Sub-Code Official/ Inspector; and
WHEREAS, by Resolution adopted, 2020, Stratford authorized the
execution of a Shared Services Agreement ("Agreement") with Mt. Ephraim for the services of Stratford's
Electrical Sub-Code Official/ Inspector; and
WHEREAS, Stratford is agreeable to providing said services;
NOW, THEREFORE, for and in consideration of the mutual covenants and agreements between
the parties and for the consideration set forth below, the parties hereto agree as follows:

- Term. The term of this agreement shall commence January 1, 2020 and ending December 31, 2023.
- 2. Scope of Services. Stratford agrees that its Electrical Sub-Code Official/Inspector will also serve as Electrical Sub-Code Official/Inspector for Mt. Ephraim and comply with all New Jersey regulations for the term of this Agreement as set forth herein, or as extended by mutual agreement of the parties.

- Fees to Stratford. Beginning on the effective date of this agreement, January 1, 2020, through December 31, 2020, Mt. Ephraim shall pay Stratford for the services to be provided in the sum of \$1,875.00 quarterly, in advance, due January 15, April 15, July 15 and October 15.
 - Beginning January 1, 2021, through December 31, 2023, Mt. Ephraim shall pay Stratford for the services to be provided in the sum of \$2,125.00 quarterly, in advance, due January 15, April 15, July 15 and October 15.
 - Any Modifications of the service to be provided, as set forth in Section 2 above, must be mutually agreed to between the parties and may result in a change of fee amounts.
- 4. <u>Insurance</u>. During the term of this contract, Stratford shall maintain insurance pursuant to the requirements of N.J.A.C 7:26H-6.17, including employee liability and workers compensation.
- 5. <u>Indemnification</u>. To the fullest extent permitted by law, Mt. Ephraim and Stratford shall indemnify, defend and hold each other harmless along with their respective agents and employees, from and against all claims, damages, losses, liabilities and expenses, including, but not limited to, attorney's fees and court costs, arising out of, resulting from or in any way relating to, either directly or indirectly:
 - a) the performance of the work;
 - b) the breach of any of the terms and conditions of this agreement;
 - c) the negligent or intentional acts or omissions of Mount Ephraim, its employees, agents and/or subcontractors;
 - d) bodily injury, sickness and/or disease, including death, at any time resulting form such bodily injury, sickness or disease, sustained by any person while in, on or about the site and surrounding areas where such injury, sickness, disease and/or death arose out of or was in any way connected with the work of, the performance of, or failure to properly perform the work;
 - e) any liability based upon Mount Ephraim's negligence imputed to Stratford;
 - f) damage to property of Mount Ephraim, Stratford or any other person or entity arising out of, incident to, or in connection with the performance of the work;

- g) laborers, mechanics and materialmen's liens, and all other liens and charges of every character whatsoever, arising out of work to be performed by this agreement; and/or
- h) any other cause of action which may be brought against Stratford arising out of or in any way relating to the work and Mount Ephraim's obligations hereunder.
 - This indemnification and hold harmless agreement shall apply in all instances whether Stratford is a plaintiff, or is made a direct party to the initial action or claim or is subsequently made a party to the action by
- 6. Assignment, delegation or transfer. Stratford acknowledges and agrees that the services and duties required hereunder are personal, as a result of which Stratford shall not assign, delegate or otherwise transfer any of its rights or duties hereunder without the prior written consent of Mt. Ephraim, such consent to be given or withheld by Mt. Ephraim in the borough's sole discretion. Any attempted assignment, delegation or transfer by Stratford without such consent of Mt. Ephraim shall be of no force or effect whatsoever and shall be null and void.
- 7. Action or failure to act. No action or failure to act by Mt. Ephraim shall constitute a waiver of any right or duty afforded Mt. Ephraim pursuant to this Agreement, nor shall any such action or failure to act constitute an approval of or acquiescence in any breach hereunder except as may be specifically agreed to in writing.
- 8. <u>Affirmative Action</u>. The parties hereto agree to incorporate herein the requirements of P.L. 1975, c. 127, as amended, and Stratford further agrees to comply with the regulations promulgated thereto by the Treasurer, as set forth at <u>N.J.A.C. 17:27-5.2</u>, <u>et seq.</u> Specifically, during the performance of this contract, Stratford agrees as follows:
 - a) Stratford, where applicable, will not discriminate against any employee or applicant for employment because of age, race, creed, color, natural origin, ancestry, marital status or sex, affectional or sexual orientation. Stratford will take affirmative action to ensure that such applicants are recruited and employed, and that the employees are treated during employment, without regard to their age, race, creed, color, natural origin, ancestry, marital status or sex, affectional or sexual orientation. Such actions include, but not be limited to

the following: employment, upgrading, demotion, or transfer; recruitment or recruitment advertising; layoff or termination; rates of pay or other forms of compensation; and selection for training, including apprenticeship. Stratford agrees to post in conspicuous places, available to employees and applicants for employment, notices to be provided by the Public Agency Compliance Officer setting forth provisions of the nondiscrimination clause;

- b) Stratford, where applicable, will in all solicitations or advertisements for employees placed by or on behalf of Stratford, state that all qualified applicants will receive consideration for employment without regard to age, race, creed, color, national origin, ancestry, marital status or sex, affectional or sexual orientation;
- c) Stratford, where applicable, will send to each labor union or representative of workers with which it has a collective bargaining agreement or other contract or understanding, a notice to be provided by the Agency Contracting Officer advising the labor union or workers' representative of Stratford commitments under this act and shall post copies of the notice in conspicuous places available to employees and applicants for employment.
- d) Stratford, where applicable, agrees to comply with any regulations promulgated by the Treasurer pursuant to P.L. 1975, c. 127, as amended and supplemented from time to time and the Americans with Disabilities Act.
- e) Stratford agrees to attempt in good faith to employ minority and female workers consistent with the applicable county employment goals prescribed by N.J.A.C_" 17:27-5.2 promulgated by the Treasurer pursuant to P.L. 1975, c. 127, as amended and supplemented from time to time or in accordance with a binding determination of the applicable county employment goals determined by the Affirmative Action pursuant to N.J.A.C_ 17:27-5.2 promulgated by the treasurer pursuant to P.L. 1975, c. 127, as amended and supplemented from time to time.
- f) Stratford agrees to inform in writing appropriate recruitment agencies in the area, including employment agencies, placement bureaus, colleges, universities, labor unions, that it does

- not discriminate on the basis of age creed color, national origin, ancestry, marital status or sex, affectional or sexual orientation, and that it will discontinue the use of any recruitment agency which engages in direct or indirect discriminatory practices.
- g) Stratford agrees to revise any of its testing procedures, if necessary, to assure that all personal testing conforms with the principles of job-related testing, as established by the statutes and court decisions of the State of New Jersey and as established by applicable federal law and applicable federal court decisions.
- h) Stratford agrees to review all procedures relating to transfer, upgrading, downgrading and layoff to ensure that all such actions are taken without regard to age, creed, color, national origin, ancestry, marital status or sex, affectional or sexual orientation, and conform with the applicable employment goals, consistent with the statutes and court decisions of the State of New Jersey, and applicable federal law and applicable federal court decisions.

 Stratford shall furnish such reports or other documents to the Affirmative Action Office as may be requested by the office from time to time in order to carry out the purpose of their regulations, and public agencies shall furnish such information as may be requested by the Affirmative Action Office for conducting a compliance investigation pursuant to Subchapter 10 of the Administrative Code(N.J.A.C 17:27).
- 9. Entire Understanding. This agreement sets forth the entire understanding between Stratford and Mount Ephraim with respect to the subject matter hereof.
