Dear Municipal Leader:

It has come to the New Jersey Public Advocate's attention that some tenants are being inappropriately forced out of their homes when the building in which they are living has been foreclosed. Under NJ law, most tenants have the right to remain in their homes during and after a foreclosure.

As part of our effort to ensure that tenants are aware of their rights, we are inviting municipalities to include on their website a link to the NJ Public Advocate webpage about the rights of tenants in foreclosed properties. We hope that this link will provide local constituents and municipal officials easy access to information about the rights of tenants in foreclosed properties.
